Spring is the perfect time to bridge cool-season blooms with warm-season favorites for nonstop color.

- ✿ Deadhead spent blooms to encourage more flowers
- 💧 Water deeply and consistently
- 🕒 Feed every 2–3 weeks
- ✿ Mulch to retain moisture and suppress weeds
- ☀️ Protect tender plants from late frosts

SPRING GARDEN TASKS

1

REFRESH BEDS

Clean up leaves and debris, trim back old growth, and add compost or mulch to nourish the soil.



2

START SEEDS

Sow cool-season flowers indoors or direct seed hardy annuals like snapdragons, poppies, and larkspur outdoors. Water gently and keep soil moist.



3

PLANT & TRANSPLANT

Plant seeds or young plants in the garden once the soil has warmed. Space properly for healthy growth.



4

PREPARE FOR BLOOMS

Add plant supports, labels, and trellises for tall growers. Plan for a season of continuous blooms.



CARE TIPS FOR SPRING

- Water early in the morning.
- Fertilize lightly every 2–3 weeks.
- Deadhead often to prolong blooms.
- Harvest cool-season blooms before heat sets in.
- Pinch back seedlings for bushier growth.
